within professional and ministerial practice Increasingly Christian denominations are expressing a need for trained supervisors to support those in pastoral ministry. In the face of a multiplicity of challenges: climate change, relational malpractice, racial injustice, social care and poverty gaps, the postpandemic Church, with its reduced clergy, needs to review, prioritise and structure as never before.

The changing nature of local and lay ministry requires pastoral ministers to oversee teams and develop skills in line-management, supervision and reflective practice. This is in order to embody Kingdom life with all the skill, wisdom and mutual accountability necessary to honour the people and the Christ we serve.

The Professional Diploma in Pastoral Supervision is a short course, which follows on from PCPS, the Professional Certificate in Pastoral Supervision. Its aim is to support the reflective practice of graduates of the certificate course as you integrate theory and practice and to prepare you, as you build up your hours of regular pastoral supervision in order to be eligible for APSE* accreditation. This recognition will allow you to offer services nationally and enjoy fellowship and ongoing development alongside other professionals in this field.

Who is the course for?

This new course, may be of interest to you if:

- You have responsibility for clergy wellbeing
- You lead a team of lay and/or ordained colleagues and have supervisory responsibilities
- You are in independent practice supervising those in pastoral ministry
- You have oversight of pastoral care teams within your church

What are the course aims?

- To enable you to continue integrating theological, personal, psychological, ethical and skillful practice in your work as a lay or ordained pastoral practitioner
- To support you in completing the requirements for APSE membership and accreditation as a pastoral supervisor



What are the entry requirements?

This course is suitable for you if:

- You have already successfully completed IPCS's Professional Certificate in Pastoral Supervision, or the Certificate in Reflective Practice & Pastoral Supervision OR equivalent (Contact us to check)
- You have carried out a minimum of 10 hours of pastoral supervision with at least two different supervisees since completion of your initial training with IPCS
- You have received at least 3 sessions of supervision upon that practice and would like to extend your skills to include group supervision.
- You comply with your professional Code of Ethics and the APSE Code of Conduct, see www.pastoralsupervision.org.uk

What will I gain on completion?

- You will have received further in-depth training in pastoral supervision in company with colleagues who are also in regular supervisory roles
- You will have met the minimum training and practice requirements for accreditation by the APSE
- You will have completed an assignment and practice logs, which will prepare you for making your application for APSE accreditation
- You will receive the Professional Diploma in Pastoral Supervision, awarded by the Institute of Pastoral Counselling and Supervision
